THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA



- The District of Columbia, also known as "Washington, D.C." is the capital of the United States, home to the federal government, and spans 109 square kilometers (68 square miles).
- We share borders with Virginia and Maryland and are in the heart of the Mid-Atlantic on the East Coast.
- Since the passage of the DC Home Rule Act on December 24, 1973, **the District has been governed much like any state in the US but** is not considered a U.S. state.
- The DC metro area (MSA) population is **6.37 million people.** The metro area has **grown by 15% since 2010**, compared to a national growth rate of 9% over the same period. District of Columbia population is 706,000.
- We are a very young city with 28% of our population is aged 20-34, compared to just 20% nationally.
- Government Structure includes a Mayor (Executive Branch) Muriel Bowser and 13person Council of the District of Columbia (Legislative Body), 1 non-voting delegate to the US House of Representatives and 2 shadow Senators.





- Washington, DC-Baltimore Region ranked #3 in the country for life science talent by CBRE








JLABS




WORLD-CLASS CONNECTIVITY

The DC metro area provides easy access to major domestic and international destinations via three airports: Reagan National (DCA), Dulles International (IAD), and Baltimore/Washington International (BWI).


INTERNATIONAL INFLUENCE

Home to International Leaders

- One in five people in the DC metro area (22.8%) are foreign-born, contributing to the region's ethnic, linguistic, and cultural diversity
- An estimated **101,000 immigrant entrepreneurs reside in the metro** area (New American Economy, 2019)
- Home to more than 177 embassies, The World Bank, and International Monetary Fund
- Three airports serve the Washington, D.C. metro: Baltimore/Washington International, Reagan National, and Dulles International, which is the fastest growing international airport in the U.S. (MWAA, 2024)
- More than 168 languages are spoken in the metro area, with 26% of the population (aged 5+) speaking a language other than English at home (Census, 2020)


International Migration to DC Metro

• An estimated 75,000 movers from abroad over one year



FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT

- Over 500 international companies with a presence in the DC Metro Area representing 62 countries.¹ Almost half of DC Metro Area's international companies have a presence in the city of Washington, DC.
- 140 greenfield FDI projects announced in DC with an estimated capital expenditure (capex) of \$1.9 billion and an estimated 6,811 jobs created from 2013 - 2022.²





WASHINGTON, DC & KOREA

- 24 Korean Companies located in Washington, DC region¹
- Close to 60,000 Korean immigrants in Washington, DC region²
- Over 2% of population in Washington, DC is of Korean descent³

GLOBAL CLIMATE LEADER



- DC is a global climate leader First LEED Platinum City in the world
- #1 park system in the US (Trust for Public Land, 2022)
- **98% of District residents live within a 10-minute walk to a park**, compared to the national average of 55%
- DC was the first city in the US to have a Building Energy Performance Standard (BEPS) policy, which is now being adapted nationwide and modeled off DC's policy
- Goal to be carbon neutral and climate resilient by 2045 and cut GHG emissions by 60% by 2032
- More than 5 million SF of green roof in the city
- Rock Creek Park is more than 2x the size of NYC's Central Park



WASHINGTON, DC GLOBAL SOFT LANDING

ELIGIBILITY

- Strong, verified interest in establishing a presence in Washington, DC within the next 12 months.
- Company will have at least one full-time employee physically staffed at the soft landing space for the duration of program participation.
- Must commit to a minimum of 3 months in the soft landing space.
- Proven ability to pay rent.

PROCESS

VITALITY FUND

Multi-year, performance-based incentive program for companies relocating to or expanding in the District and creating jobs.

- Awards: Award amount is based on size of the project, including fiscal impact, new jobs, wages, capital investment, and location details. *Average award \$3,800 per job*
- Award Disbursement: Annual payments based on company meeting targets for new jobs and capital investment
- When to Apply: Companies should apply during their location decision-making process and ideally, before a lease is signed

ELIGIBILITY

- Lease or own a business location of at least **7,000 square feet** in **the District and** remain in the space for at least **5 years**.
- Have 25 or more employees at the time of application.
- Be in one of the following industry sectors:
 - Technology and Innovation
 - Life Sciences
 - Professional Services
 - Finance and Insurance
 - Manufacturing
 - Research
 - Communications & Marketing
 - Consulting Services
 - Education
- Require employees, in the aggregate, to be on-site at least 50% of work hours.
- Participate in a workforce development program for DC residents OR spend at least 5% of annual contracting with local businesses.
